■ **Cameron Gordon, Inkster:** A three-year starter, Gordon had 49 receptions for 863 yards and eight TDs. He also started at strong safety and had 126 tackles, five sacks, five INTs and three fumble recoveries. "He's a fierce competitor," coach Greg Carter said. "Offensively and defensively he can be the best player on the field."



■ **Will Sturges, Detroit Southeastern:** Sturges was a versatile player for the Detroit Public School League champions. He played quarterback, defensive back and returned kicks, but was most effective as a receiver. He had 56 receptions for 1,060 yards and 13 TDs, and rushed for 310 yards and five TDs. "He did everything we asked of him," coach Donshell English said.



■ **Cody Wilson, Rochester Adams:** Wilson was Adams' home-run threat. He had 54 receptions for 985 yards and 12 TDs, and rushed 64 times for 440 yards and six TDs. Wilson returned a kickoff for a TD and also threw a TD pass. "Cody is a great all-around player," coach Tony Patriitto said. "As a receiver he is a great route runner with awesome hands."

LINEMEN



■ **Tyler Benson, Lake Orion:** A two-year starter at center, Benson was named team MVP. Lake Orion improved offensively throughout the season, eventually reaching the Division 1 final. "It all started with him," coach Chris Bell said. "He was the rock that held everything together. He helped with the freshman quarterback to change signal calls. And he didn't give up a sack."



■ **Jeff Fantuzzi, Macomb Dakota:** Fantuzzi, an offensive tackle, started on last year's undefeated Division 1 state championship team. Coach Mike Giannone said he is a tough kid with good feet and a great punch that "allows us to run his side." Fantuzzi also has the ability to pull and trap, and he had 17 pancake blocks. Fantuzzi has committed to Central Michigan.



■ **Eric Fisher, Rochester Hills Stoney Creek:** A big and tall offensive tackle, Fisher has quick feet and uses his hands well to pass block. "Eric has grown into an outstanding football player over the last four years in our football program," coach Calvin Gross said. "He is a strong and athletic player that works at getting better each day. He is one of the best student/athletes to come out of our program." Fisher committed to Central Michigan.



■ **Andrew Grabowski, Salem:** Grabowski started at left offensive tackle for three years. "It is no accident the lions' share of our total yards were run to the left," coach Parker Salowich said. "Drew is also a wonderful teammate with terrific leadership skills. His ability to block in space and protect our passer are his best qualities as a player."

■ **Justin Sneddon, Canton:** A team captain, Sneddon was named KLAA South Division offensive player of the year. He bench presses 350 pounds, so though undersized for an offensive tackle, he is strong and quick. "He was a very physical player that just likes to hit people," coach Tim Baechler said. Canton averaged 342 yards rushing.

QUARTERBACK



■ **Jason Fracassa, Sterling Heights Stevenson:** Fracassa, a three-year starter, passed for 1,463 as a freshman and 1,366 as a sophomore. This season, he was 210-for-350 (61 percent) for 3,357 yards and 34 TDs and eight INTs. Coach Rick Bye said he is a great decision-maker and runs our offense with precision. Fracassa is the co-MVP of the MAC Red. Stevenson (10-2) was co-champion of the MAC Red and won the district championship.

RUNNING BACKS



■ **Teric Jones, Detroit Cass Tech:** In his first season as the starting tailback, Jones rushed for 1,663 yards and 16 TDs, leading one of Detroit Public School League's top running attacks. Jones returned punts and kickoffs and totaled 2,125 all-purpose yards. Jones has committed to Michigan.



■ **Austin White, Livonia Stevenson:** One of the most dynamic backs in the state, White rushed for 1,610 yards and 28 TDs on 228 carries. He also had 21 receptions for 310 yards and four TDs, threw a TD pass, and returned nine kickoffs for 279 yards. "It's almost like there's nothing he can't do," coach Tim Gabel said. "He sets up his blocks and has a great work ethic in practice."

KICKER



■ **Kevin Muma, Troy:** Muma was the kicker, punter and the starting quarterback. He threw for 966 yards and rushed for 438, averaged 37 yards on 28 punts, and of his 55 kickoffs, 43 went for touchbacks. He was 12-for-19 on field goals with a long of 52 yards (school record) and 32-for-35 on extra points.
